How to support your child's studies

- Encourage them to read. 
- Talk to them. Talking and listening plays an essential role in the child's school success.
- Take them to the library. 
- Meet your child's teacher.
- Take the effort to get to know who's who at your child's class.
- Attend meetings with the teacher and keep in touch with him/her.
- Find out how your child is doing at school. Is your child doing well at school? Is he or she having trouble learning, behaving, or studying? Is there a problem with another student, teacher, or administrator?
- Make sure that homework is ready (your reluctance to help with homework does not support your child), prepare him/her for a test.
- Learn what the school may be offering.
- Ask questions (if something makes you concerned, talk to the teacher or seek advice at school).
- Demonstrate a positive attitude about education.
- Monitor TV, games, the internet... It's not because you are spying on them, but because you need to know how they use the internet or whether they don't spend more time watching TV than doing school work. 
- Encourage them to be responsible and independent.
- Encourage active learning – exploring things, solving problems.
