



Accident / Illness

Car Accident Checklist (you may keep a copy in your car)

- Check to see if anyone needs urgent medical care. If yes, try to help them if you
 know how to stop heavy bleeding. Do not move seriously injured people unless it's a
 life-threatening situation (combustion of the car). Call an ambulance.
- 2. Call police (don't discuss the issue of fault with the other party involved)
- 3. **Get the facts about the accident**. For this purpose, you will need to have:
- ✓ Car accident form
- ✓ Information about the driver of the other vehicle:
 - name
 - address
 - phone number
- ✓ Information about the other driver's insurance:
 - insurance company
 - insurance number
- ✓ Information about the car involved in the accident:
 - vehicle description colour
 - model type
 - year
 - vehicle registration information
 - plate number
 - consider taking photos for your record

- ✓ Information about the car accident or collision:
 - date and time of the accident
 - address or approximate address
 - road or nearest street
 - directions of the travel
 - notes about weather
 - if there are witnesses, you will need their names and contact information
 - write down the name of the police officer that arrives at the accident scene
- 4. The next step is to inform your insurance company, they will give you information on how to proceed.
